The proposed 2018 Camden Redevelopment Agency (CRA) budget entails an overall decrease of \$777,650 (27.66%) compared to the FYE 2017 adopted budget.

The proposed 2018 budget includes no increases in two (2) of the major Operation Appropriation items (specifically, Administration and Professional Services Expense categories). However, the proposed budget does reflect significant decreases in the major Operation Appropriation (specifically, Personnel Expense category) and the Non-Operating Appropriation (specifically, Operations and Maintenance Reserve category).

The proposed 2018 budget includes significant decreases in the major Other Operating Revenue items (specifically, Project Administration and Land Sales categories)

The FYE 2018 annual budget has been developed in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:31-2. There are several variances over +/-10% for certain categories compared to the current year's adopted budget. They are follows:

Operating Appropriations:

Personnel – Decrease of \$155,494 (11.28%). This significant change has been affected by four (4) employment vacancies. To ensure the CRAs ability to sustain its anticipated appropriations and current staff levels, the Agency will defer the fulfillment of these vacant positions to a future fiscal year.

Non-Operating Appropriations:

Operations & Maintenance Reserve- Decrease of \$622,157 (68.54 %). This significant change has been affected by more than a 27.66% decrease in Total Other Operating Revenue. This Revenue change is attributed to decreases in Anticipated Land Sales and Project Administration/Development Fees categories.

The business of the Agency continues to be affected by state and federal economic forces and therefore, maintains the goal of establishing an Operating Reserve capable of maintaining the organization for at least one complete fiscal year. (See attachment #1- 2018 Project Listing)

2. Complete a brief statement on the impact the proposed Annual Budget will have on Anticipated Revenues, especially service charges and on the general purpose/component unit financial statements. Explain significant increases or decreases, if any. An increase or decrease is considered significant if it is over +/-10% from the current year adopted budget.

There are three (3) line item variances over +/-10% for certain categories within the Other Operating Revenues Schedule compared to the current year's adopted budget. They are as follows:

Project Administration/Redevelopment Fees - Decrease of \$176,750 (39.13%)

The tremendous development activities initiated by the New Jersey Economic Opportunity Act of 2013 (EOA), of which the CRA's Project Administration/Redevelopment fees were positively impacted in 2017, are beginning to taper off. The EOA is scheduled to sunset in 2018 for housing and 2019 for commercial development. This revenue item is directly tied to the anticipated decrease of development activities within the budget year. Smaller scale economic, institutional, and housing development is anticipated in the upcoming year. (See attached – 2018 Project Listing)

Land Sales-Decrease of \$520,900 (28%)

The anticipated sunset of the New Jersey Economic Opportunity Act of 2013 (EOA) and its expected decline of housing and commercial development activities has also affected the Agency's land sale opportunities in 2018. The large-scale development projects and therefore, the land sale deals realized in the past few fiscal years, will decrease sharply in 2018. This revenue item is directly tied to the anticipated decrease of development activities within the budget year. Smaller scale economic, institutional, and housing development is anticipated in the upcoming year. (See attached – 2018 Project Listing)

Other Receivables- Decrease of \$80,000 (54%)

In the 2017 budget, there was a receivable item of \$136,000 included in the budget. This item was a one-time payment and is not included in the 2018 budget. This line item is utilized for revenue items that do not fall within the other revenue categories. It tends to include one-time payments and/or items that fluctuate year to year.

3. Describe the state of the local/regional economy and how it may impact the proposed Annual Budget, including the planned Capital Budget/Program.

CRA's redevelopment projects and programs are the result an aligned focus of the CRA staff and Board of Commissioners with the work of the City of Camden for strategic area redevelopment in the City. Execution of redevelopment projects and targeted city-wide planning continues to allow for efficient leveraging of land resources as well as public and private financing. Camden is in the midst of several leadership transitions from a change in the Mayor and Governor's administrations.

The New Jersey Economic Opportunity Act of 2013 (EOA), as Camden's primary financial incentive for redevelopment deals is slated to sunset for housing in 2018 and commercial development in 2019. (We however understand that there is a legislative push to extend EOA beyond the sunset deadline).

Currently, there are 33 EOA redevelopment projects in Camden of which 19 projects have involved CRA. These projects reflect over 3 billion dollars public and private investments. They will result in an increase of the working population in the City over the next 3 to 5 years by an additional 10,000 to 12,000 employees. Camden must sustain the momentum of such extraordinary development to make our communities more livable.

A slow-down of larger development projects may be expected in the coming year due to the availability and built out of large contiguous commercial sites. CRA anticipates the sale of smaller development parcels to mid-sized developers, as per the terms of redevelopment and option agreements, of which the majority are fully executed and the few of which are in the final stages of negotiation and/or the formal terms and conditions' draft process. Camden will experience the next wave of redevelopment in the areas of institutional, housing, and small commercial sites. (See attached – 2018 Project Listing)

For commercial development, whether large or mid-sized transactions they are extremely complex; but these projects are moving ahead. Where in 2018, we anticipate the assembly of smaller sites to accommodate mid-size developments; such transactions will provide the Agency with the funds to continue planned redevelopment work. (See attached 2018 Project List).

Crucial to economic development is CRA's role as Brownfield Coordinator for the City of Camden. As the Brownfield Coordinator, CRA is charged with applying for and implementing approximately \$24 million dollars in federal and state grant funds for the reuse of underutilized and contaminated sites.

Available housing product is a significant issue for Camden's ability to attract and retain middle income households that pay property taxes and add to the City's critical mass. CRA owns more than 350+/- properties within 2 neighborhoods in which large scale institutional development is under construction. CRA is working collaboratively with the City's anchor education and medical institutions in their physical investment strategies for expansion of existing and build-out of new medical and educational facilities. For housing developers this bodes well of building new markets of opportunity for rental and ownership developments for workforce, low, middle and market rate housing in targeted neighborhoods.

The Mt. Ephraim Choice Neighborhood Transformation Plan, which includes 3 neighborhoods in South Camden is the current impetus for work force housing redevelopment. As lead and coapplicants, the Housing Authority and City of Camden was awarded a \$13.2 million in a federal Choice Neighborhood grant, leveraging about \$150 million dollars in redevelopment. CRA's work will be to support housing and revitalization efforts within the development clusters directly adjacent to and surrounding the Choice neighborhood. The CRA and a private housing developer are responsible for about 200+/- units of housing over the next 3 years, connecting up new and improved assets, such as parks, public schools, EOA businesses, and transportation.

Given various economic, housing, and institutional development activities that have occurred in years 2014-2017, there has been an increase in the land appraisal values within the city which has increased the Fair Market Value of CRA owned land that is slated to be sold in 2018. And, CRA continues to aggressively pursue all available Federal, State, and private funding opportunities which can further the redevelopment opportunities in the city.
