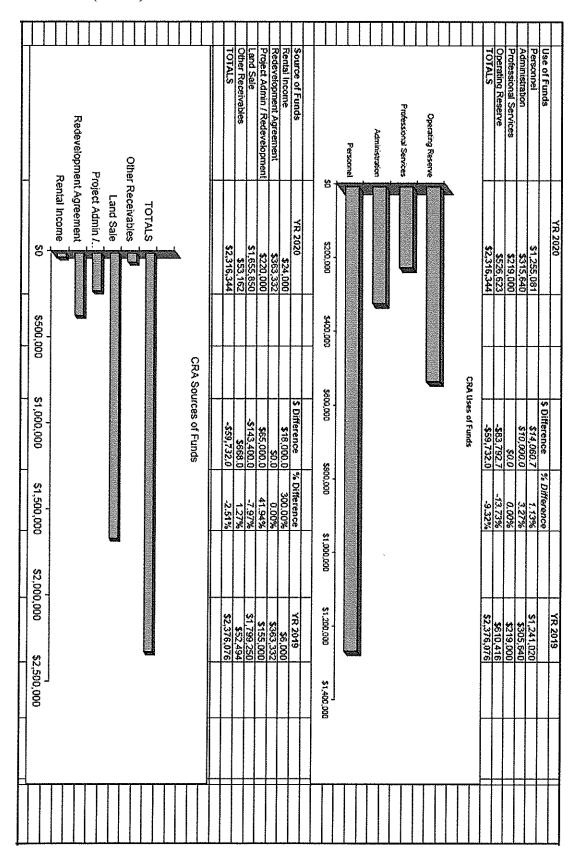

The overall proposed 2020 Camden Redevelopment Agency (CRA) budget does not entail a variance over +/- 10%. The FYE 2020 Budget has an overall decrease of \$59,732 (-2.5%) compared to the FYE 2019 adopted budget.

However, the proposed budget does reflect a significant increase in two (2) Other Operating Revenue line items, specifically Rental Income and Project Admin/Redevelopment Fee line items.

Rental Income: This line item has realized a 300% (\$18,000) increase compared to the 2019 adopted budget. This increase is due to an executed land lease agreement between the CRA and CI Properties. This agreement is for a term of 12 months (with the option for two extensions) at the lease amount of \$1,500 per month; \$18,000 for 12 months. (See Attachment #1)

Project Admin/Redevelopment Fee: This line item has realized a 41.9% (\$65,000) increase compared to the 2019 adopted budget. This increase is due to new development projects that include Project Admin/Redevelopment Fees that will be realized in 2020. There are also four (4) projects in the adopted 2019 budget that were delayed and are scheduled to occur in 2020, specifically items #7,8,11and15 detailed in the FYE 2020 Revenue Description portion of Attachment #1.

The proposed budget also reflects a significant decrease in one (1) Non - Operating Appropriations line item, specifically Operations and Maintenance Reserve.

Operations and Maintenance Reserve: This line item has realized a 13.7% (-\$83,793) decrease compared to the 2019 adopted budget. This decrease is due to the decrease in anticipated project revenue included in the proposed budget as compared to the 2019 adopted budget (See 2020 Project Listing in Attachment #2)

2. Describe the state of the local/regional economy and how it may impact the proposed Annual Budget, including the planned Capital Budget/Program. (Example Consider New Development

### projects such as Housing /Commercial projects impact on the Authorities expenses or revenues)

CRA's redevelopment projects and programs represent an aligned focus of the CRA staff and Board of Commissioners with the City of Camden that allow for strategic area redevelopment by efficient leveraging of land resources, public and private financing, and subsequent, execution of redevelopment projects in targeted areas citywide.

Currently state and federal tax incentives are in a state of flux and, will continue into FY 2020. The New Jersey Economic Opportunity Act of 2013 (EOA) projects, in which CRA is currently involved total eight (out of 23) that are in various stages of completion. Now that the EOA legislation and incentive programs have sunset in 2019, the impact on existing and new economic development activity has been immediate and dramatic; in terms of redevelopment project withdrawals and delays. However, past experience in times of external policy shifts/changes have shown that after periods of adjustment, there are periods where such activity will rebound. In this case, when new tax incentive legislation is adopted to replace EOA, new economic redevelopment projects will be attracted to the city's redevelopment areas. Building on a body of prior economic development in the city, CRA, as a redevelopment agency is poised by state statute to attract developer interest and direct investments in and outside of designated redevelopment areas. These investments must involve real property transactions, including the public site assembly of public/private land and execution of project agreements. Thus, the CRA remains a critical component of the city serving as the city's agent, particularly in the disposition of publically owned properties for redevelopment purposes. From these real property transactions, CRA's revenues will be generated from land sale transactions, redevelopment agreement fees, and related shared services agreements. (See 2020 Project Listing in Attachment #2)

Congress in the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 established a new federal new community development program involving Opportunity Zones. Opportunity Zones are designed to encourage long-term investments in low-income urban communities. The City of Camden has seven Opportunity Zone designations (OZ), which provide a federal tax incentive for investors, and revenues from economic and housing development opportunities for the city and CRA. Each of the seven OZs give the City and CRA a locational and economic advantage in attracting new project investments, particularly in those corridors where CRA and the City are creating new commercial/industrial/residential areas.

For upcoming commercial/industrial development, CRA anticipates the sale of smaller development parcels to mid-sized developers, as per the terms of redevelopment and option agreements, of which several are fully executed and a few of which are in the final stages of negotiation and/or the formal terms and conditions' draft process. (See 2020 Project Listing in Attachment #2)

In addition, critical to attracting and sustaining developer interest, the CRA administers the City's Brownfield Program to identify, prioritize and target the reuse, reutilization, and remediation of former contaminated commercial/industrial sites. Currently, the Brownfield Program administers \$24 million dollars in federal and state grant funds for the reuse of underutilized and contaminated sites. The reclamation and reuse of these properties will result in commercial/industrial land sales and redevelopment fees for the CRA where existing sites for new commercial/industrial/residential uses are contemplated. See 2020 Project Listing in Attachment #2)

For residential development, available quality-housing products challenge Camden's ability to attract and retain middle-income households that will pay property taxes and add to the City's critical mass. Given various economic, housing, and institutional development activities that have occurred in recent years land values are increasing within the city. CRA has 593 properties with a book value of \$9,600,506. The majority of these properties are located in the Cooper/Lanning Census Tract, which is a designated Opportunity Zone census tract - for CRA this creates an exceptional opportunity for attracting mixed income housing developers that can utilize equity funds through the Opportunity Zone investments to make projects financially feasible. This "gap" financing vehicle for market-rate, mixed income residential housing was unavailable previously. In addition, the Governor has signed legislation to re-direct some \$65 million in Affordable Housing Trust funds for production of affordable rental and for sale housing, which are slated to be available in the first quarter of 2020. These funds also are critical to feasible development of mix-use and mix-income residential housing.

For the upcoming 2020 term, several mixed use, mixed-income residential redevelopment projects, the majority of which are located within designated Opportunity Zone areas and Affordable Housing Trust funds will result in revenues for the Agency as these transactions are finalized. See 2020 Project Listing in attachment #2)

CRA continues to aggressively pursue other means of generating revenue during this period of adjustment, including the implementation of a rational, strategic approach to disposing of its surplus property by way of public auction, particularly in non-redevelopment areas of the city. CRA continues to aggressively market public sites and attract developer interest in redevelopment opportunities. CRA continues to aggressively pursue all available Federal, State, and private funding opportunities which can further the redevelopment opportunities in the city and generate revenues for the Agency and ratables for the city.

The implementation of GASB 68, which required recording of the unfunded pension liability, has resulted in a deficit of Unrestricted Net Position in the most recent audit. The Agency will continue to pay the required annual pension contribution to offset the Pension liability. The Agency will also reduce spending were possible and actively seek new revenue opportunities, specifically in the categories of land sales, redevelopment agreement fees, and project management fees.

The Agency also has an Operating Deficit in the most recent audit caused mostly by the significant decrease in Grant Revenues and Project Admin/Redevelopment Fees. Toward the goal of eliminating these losses, the Agency will continue to decrease spending were possible and has developed strategies to increase Rental Income through short-term land lease Agreements; Land Sales through public auctions of excess undevelopable parcels; Land Sales and Project Management/Administrative Fees through the various development activities to be realized due to the seven designated Opportunity Zones throughout the City of Camden.
