Note: Several Commissioners disconnected from the call following the adoption of Resolutions. Proceedings were suspended until quorum was re-established.

Public Comments

Several representatives of the Cramer Hill Local Organizing Committee (affiliated with St. Anthony's and the Camden Churches Organized for People) were present. They raised concerns pertaining to abandoned properties.

Ms. Lydia Bragg of 931 N. 19th Street stated some 20 houses in need of demolition have been identified in Cramer Hill. Reportedly, the attendees previously sought assistance through Councilman Lopez, Code Enforcement officials, and others. Six (6) of the properties are/were owned by CRA. One has been demolished. These remain: 903, 906, 915, 926, and 936 on N. 19th Street.

Ms. Bragg expressed great concern about a privately owned house at 930 N. 19th Street. Housing Director Olivette Simpson will check to see if this property is on the City's Abandoned Properties List.

Ms. Bragg also noted: TLFC-related issues previously presented barriers. The group is optimistic about demolition prospects now that the properties are owned by CRA.

Code Enforcement is to be notified to ensure violations are addressed. Representatives are to contact Ombudsman Vincent Basara, so properties can be placed on the Abandoned Properties list.

Per Chair Torres' direction, addresses of speakers were secured, so CRA can further investigate.

Eulisis Delgado spoke on behalf of Andres Rivera of 917 N. 19th Street regarding 915 N. 19th Street, reporting that the structure is a rat and roach infested property, with trash, prostitution, drug, and fungus problems. The basement floods. Expenses to address these conditions have been covered at Mr. Rivera's personal expense.

(Mr. Hagamin re-joined the meeting.)

Ann Hurley of 209 Westover Drive, Cherry Hill, NJ, advised that she has been working on this issue for over four (4) years. She previously informed by Code Enforcement Division Director Iraida Afanador and others of the existence of an abandoned properties list, but there are so many different lists, residents are uncertain of which list is Official. Ms. Simpson noted the City's official list of abandoned properties is on the City website. It is maintained by City Properties, the City's Law Department and the BGDT Ombudsman. The Ombudsman is responsible for having properties added and/or removed from the list.

910 N 19 St...Mr. Felip Siduroa of 910 N. 19th Street stated he has a problem with a house that has been invaded (906 N. 19th Street). That property is without electricity or hot water; however, it is occupied by a squatter. Mr. Siduroa advised that he has fear of fire.

Ms. Torres asked if this property is CRA-owned and what can be done. Ms. Simpson reported several properties have already been inspected; three (3) houses are on the CRA's demolition list. She introduced Construction Manager Dwaine Williams, who is coordinating the project. Properties at 926, 936 N. 19, and 933 No 20th will be demolished. Property at 906 N. 19th Street will be re-inspected and re-boarded.

Kristin Nalen of St. Anthony's, who lives in Palmyra, noted that she has spoken with some 15 residents who have similar concerns. She asked that CRA meet with the neighbors to discuss prioritization of demolition, stabilization, and conveyance of properties.
